Recipe for Class 63: Dorset Apple Cake

You will need an 8"lined cake tin <u>Cake Ingredients:</u> 6oz Self Raising Flour 4oz Butter 4oz Caster Sugar 2 Eggs 1/2 teaspoon vanilla essence 1lb cooking apples peeled and chopped small

<u>Crumble topping</u> 6oz Self Raising Flour 3oz Caster Sugar 3oz Butter 3oz Chopped Nuts of your choice

Cream butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Carefully add eggs and vanilla essence mixed together a little at a time until well incorporated, then fold in flour. Put cake mixture into tin, cover with apples. Make crumble by rubbing butter into flour and sugar mixed together. Sprinkle crumble over the top. Cover with nuts.

Bake at 180 degree C (or gas equivalent) for 75-90 minutes.

Please put your cake on a plate and cover it before exhibiting it at the showe.g. please use cling film or a plastic bag or a non-breakable cake cover

Show Rules and Regulations

1/ Entry is open to existing and new members and members of the public.

2/ Entry is free. Other than "Best in Show" Trophies will ONLY be awarded to <u>members</u> gaining most points in the various categories. *

3/ Exhibits may be staged the evening before the Show between 5pm and 6pm or on the day of the Show between 9am and 11:45am.

4/ Space will be allotted and exhibits must be within that space.

5/ Only flower arrangements in classes marked * may be arranged on the tables.

6/ Only the highest place achieved by each individual in any one class will be taken into account when awarding points.

7/ The judges reserve the right not to award placings in any class where exhibits are not, in the judge's opinion, of sufficient merit.

8/ Exhibits not donated to the auction must be removed before the auction starts.

9/ Exhibitors to supply own containers. The committee is not responsible for loss or damage to any exhibit or container.

10/ The judge's decision is final.

11/ Trophies are the property of the Guild and must be returned to the Secretary by the Garden Guild Meeting in June (fourth Wednesday of the month) of the following year. PLEASE DO NOT ENGRAVE THE CUPS- The Garden Guild will arrange this.

12/ All entries must be the property of the exhibitor for at least 1 month prior to the show. The committee reserve the right to inspect any exhibitor's garden (by arrangement) before the show.

13/ Children up to the age of 16 may enter any adult class if they wish to do so. However, exhibitor's age should only be indicated when entering Children's classes.

*NB all trophies must be returned to the Garden Guild by no later than the fourth Wednesday in June each year please- see 11 above.
